Review of Last Academic Year

Key areas as outlined in PE and sport premium guidance	Evaluation	Targets for Next Year
1. Increasing confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sporting activities prioritising CPD and training where needed	After feedback from staff, we introduced a new planning scheme from our local sport partnership. At the end of the year, 100% of staff were positive about the planning and all felt it was clearer to follow and broken down into more achievable steps. A member of our sport partnership came in to speak about the planning and has continued to provide guidance where needed. 100% of staff also found the dance CPD opportunity very helpful and we now have dances such as country dancing and street dancing on our curriculum. Pupil voice has been strong with 100% of the 14 children asked including pupil premium and SEND that PE lessons are fun and engaging. Childs comment <i>I like sport here. It brings us altogether. My favourite things are trying new sports. We tried archery last week and I got 5's every time. It made me feel proud of myself.</i>	Continue to monitor staff confidence and complete some lesson observations and pop ins. All staff to complete a term of CPD with our sport partnership to continue to add to knowledge and to deliver a high standard PE curriculum that is accessible for all. Staff to take part in orienteering CPD.
2. Increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sporting activities	There are many opportunities each day for the children to take part in regular physical activity. The introduction of OPAL has also helped with this. The sport leader team was strong this year and very proactive. It was a particular highlight to have our sport leaders lead an event at Tonbridge School for nearly 100 younger children in surrounding local schools. All classes have competed a weekly forest school session over the year with our trained leader. All children and staff took part in our activity day this year which was boogie bounce. It was engaging, fun and accessible for all and we now have trampettes out now during OPAL.	To monitor movement breaks within the school day to ensure all classes are consistent. To continue raising the profile of the sport leaders and to re-introduce this year with the new team. To plan our activity day.

We took part in our first colour dash event arranged by the school. It was a very memorable event that saw all children running around our local field being covered with paint! Parent comment - <i>Sports opportunities have been great. My son isn't particularly traditionally sporty, but the PE leader keeps inviting him until she finds something he will do! I love the ethos that EVERYONE represents the school, not just the sporty ones.
