


Computing Knowledge Organiser: Online Safety

Year I - Online safety

Digital footprint	The content someone shares about themselves online.	
Going online	Connecting to the internet.	
Internet	Lots of computers connected to one another.	
Personal information	Information about us e.g. full name, address, birthday.	
Post online	Placing information (such as photos or comments) on the internet.	
Sharing online	Sharing content (music, photo, videos) or information online.	
Smart device	A device on which you can use apps, a camera and make voice/video calls.	

Lots of devices can connect to the internet such as laptops, desktops, mobile phones, games consoles and tablets.




RE Knowledge Organiser: What do Christians believe God is like?

Key Vocabulary

Parable	A story told by Jesus with a hidden meaning to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson
Forgiveness	To stop blaming or being angry with someone for something that person has done, or not punish them for something.
Love	Love is the feeling that a person's happiness is very important to you, and the way you show this feeling in your behaviour towards them.
Sorry	Saying you're sorry is called apologizing. When you apologize, you're telling someone that you're sorry for the hurt you caused, even if you didn't do it on purpose.
Prayer	Christians describe prayer as a conversation with God. Prayer can be silent or said out loud. It can use set words, or a person's own words. In prayer, Christians lift their minds and hearts to God.
Praise	For Christians, praise is being thankful and respectful to God.















Year 1 - Hit Catch Run Unit 2

Knowledge Organiser

Prior Learning

Able to hit objects with hand or bat. Tracked and retrieve a rolling ball. Throw and catch a variety of balls and objects.

We are learning...

- To catch a ball over a short distance
- 2. To begin to hit a ball with power
- 3. To position ourselves in the path of the ball
- 4. To field a ball to a base
- 5. To catch a high ball
- 6. To stop other teams from scoring points

Assessment Overview

Head - Can choose where to send the ball to maximise chance to score.

Hand - Retrieve and return a ball to base.

Heart - Decide as a team the best positioning to intercept balls.

Equipment

A variety of balls, a variety of bats/rackets, cones, hoops, targets, batting tee, button cones, quoits.

Vocabulary

Batter, bowl, catch, collect, feed, field, hit, hitter, pick up, retrieve, roll, stop, strike, throw.

Unit Focus

Develop sending and receiving skills to benefit fielding as a team. Distinguish between the roles of batters and fielders. Introduce the concept of simple tactics.

Key Questions

- 1. Why should you try to hit to space?
- 2. How did you try to score maximum runs?
- 3. Why does catching the ball mean a player does not get any runs?

Rules

- Batter throws the ball into coned area and runs back and forth to marker to score points.
- Fielders must touch each cone with the ball to stop the runner.
