Curriculum Newsletter and Parent Information: Term 3

Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year! We hope you had a healthy and happy Christmas and that you were able to spend quality time with your families over the holidays. We are really looking forward to the term ahead and have some exciting learning opportunities planned, including cooking our healthy Bolognese sauces in DT and supporting our chosen charities: the RSPCA and Dementia UK.

Below, is the outline of the curriculum areas we will be covering this term:

| Subject | Areas to be covered | | | | |

| Maths | We will continue to use Maths No Problem, which is in line with the Singapore Maths approach. This encourages children to use manipulatives to support learning and approach mathematical problems in different ways. Children will also be developing their mathematical thinking in a range of contexts with particular focus on: Comparing and ordering fractions. Adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions and mixed numbers. Reading and writing decimals, Comparing and ordering decimals. | | | | |
| English | Adding and subtracting decimals. This term our focus text will be Beowulf. Our fiction writing will develop use of suspense techniques while we will also be gaining confidence with a range of grammatical concepts such as expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials and conjunctions. We will be launching this text by investigating a crime scene! | | | | |
| | We will also incorporate their non-fiction writing skills in this unit by writing a crime report and a non-chronological report about the monster Grendel. In our reading lessons, we will be looking at a range of fiction and non-fiction texts, including myths and legends and texts linking to last term's space topic. The key skills we are focusing on this term are identifying the meaning of unfamiliar vocabulary and retrieving information from a text. | | | | |
| Science | This term, our Science topic is Forces. We will be carrying out investigations to identify the effects of forces on objects in a range of circumstances. The children will be encouraged to develop a deeper understanding of scientific ideas through exploration and discussion. Key enquiries we will explore are: How does friction affect the amount of force required to move an object? What is Gravity? How does air resistance affect the speed at which an object falls? What changes the effects of water resistance? What effect to gears, levers and pulleys have on forces? | | | | |
| RE | Our RE topic this term is: People of God. In this topic, we will be exploring the big question: How can following God bring freedom and justice? We will be asking the following key questions to help us understand this topic: - Did Moses have a sense of injustice for his own people? - How did Moses's actions bring freedom for the Israelites? - What are the key themes from the story of Moses? | | | | |

| Computing | In Computing this term, we will be exploring Stop-Motion animation. We will first of all find out a old stop-motion animation toys such as Zoetropes and flipbooks. Following on from this we will be learning how to use 'Stop-Motion Studio' on the iPads to create our own simple stop-motion animations using plasticine models. This app is free to download on both apple and android device and might be fun for your child to try at home as well! | | | | |
| History | This term, we will be looking at the foundation of the British Empire between the years of 1497 and 1763, which will include further investigation of the establishment of s British colonies, global trade, India and the East India Company and The Seven Years War. | | | | |
| Art | In Art, we will be learning about Chinese Art this term. This will include learning about Calligraphy and painting using ink, and designing Ming-inspired patterns for Porcelain. | | | | |
| DT | During terms 2 and 3, focusing on nutrition, the children will research and modify a traditional Bolognese sauce recipe to make it healthier. They will cook their new and improved versions, making appropriate packaging and also learn about the ethical considerations of farming cattle. | | | | |
| Spanish | This term, our focus is to be able to say 'you have' and ask, "Do you have?" in Spanish. | | | | |
| PE | During PE this term, we will be developing our Hockey skills, including dribbling and push passes. We will also look at playing effectively at different positions on the pitch. | | | | |
| Music | During terms 3 and 4, we will be exploring old school hip hop with a focus on 'The Fresh Prince of Be Air'. As part of this unit, children will learn to listen and appraise songs; develop their skills in performing, including playing instruments as well as their knowledge of musical terms, such as, puls rhythm and pitch. | | | | |
| PSHE | This term's PSHE focus is citizenship and economic wellbeing . During this topic, we will be developing understanding about income and expenditure, borrowing, risks with money and stereotypes in the workplace. | | | | |
| Philosophy for Children (P4C) | Our P4C enquiries this term will focus on the theme of equality between males and females and selflessness. | | | | |

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PE and Forest School
