Curriculum Newsletter Year 1 - Term 4

Dear Parents/Carers,

We hope you had a lovely, relaxing half term with your families. We are looking forward to a very busy and exciting term ahead, trip to Hastings, World Book Day, Science Day, sharing assembly and we are also looking forward to discussing your child's progress with you at this term's parent consultations.

This term in history we are learning about Kings and Queens. On **Tuesday 12th March 2023** we are having a Kings and Queens Day where your child will be able to come to school dressed as a king or queen. Please note this can be something smart or a dress and does not have to be a pre brought outfit. The children will be taking part in many exciting events such as making crowns, learning a royal dance, having a parade and a royal banquet. We look forward to sharing some photos with you.

Below, is the outline of the curriculum areas we will be covering this term:

Subject	Areas to be covered
Maths	<p>We will continue to use Maths No Problem which is in line with the Singapore Maths approach. This encourages children to use manipulatives to support learning and approach mathematical problems in different ways. Children will also be developing their mathematical thinking in a range of contexts with particular focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Number and Place Value: Numbers to 40 • Calculations: Addition and Subtraction • Calculations: Multiplication
English	<p>Our texts this term are:</p> <p>We will be looking at writing our own journey tale, writing in the first person, using conjunctions and finding interesting ways to start sentences. For our poetry unit we will be creating our own acrostic poems.</p>
Science	<p>In Science we will be learning about Animals Including Humans</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and name a variety of common animals that are birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and mammals • Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. • Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and mammals, and including pets).

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify, name draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which parts of the body is associated with each sense. <p>In Science we will be looking at 'Seasonal Change'. We will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Observe changes across the four seasons. Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies. Collect and record simple data
RE	<p>Our RE learning this term will be about Salvation. We will be answering the big question, 'Why does Easter matter to Christians?' Throughout the unit we will be exploring the answers to these questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What is Salvation? Why is Good Friday good? What does an Easter egg symbolise for Christians? How do I feel about the Easter story? <p>Which Easter traditions are linked to the Easter story?</p>
PE	<p>This term we will be focusing on dance. We will be learning to build simple movement patterns from a given action and will be composing and linking actions to make simple movements phrases.</p>
PSHE	<p>We use a comprehensive PSHE programme to support us in developing fully rounded children who are healthy, sociable and emotionally literate. It covers key concepts and skills to support pupils' spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development. The programme builds on the core theme areas identified by the PSHE Association: Health and Wellbeing, Relationships and Living in the Wider World. This term, we will be continuing to focus on families and relationships before moving on to living in the wider world, with a specific focus on the topic 'health and wellbeing'.</p>
Music	<p>This term in music we will be following the Charanga Music Scheme. We will be continuing our unit 'In the Groove'. The children will listen to the main song 'In the Groove' as well as other songs in different styles. Throughout the unit, the children will build on their knowledge and understanding of music through musical activities such as: playing instruments with the song, improvisation and composition.</p>
History	<p>This term in History, we are looking at Kings and Queens. We will be looking at the role of Kings and Queens in the United Kingdom through time and how this differs to the role of Parliament. Our main historical figures that we will look at are Queen Elizabeth I, Queen Victoria and King Henry VIII.</p>

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Design and Technology	<p>This term we will be working towards creating our own balanced healthy wrap. The children will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ That 'diet' means the food and drink that a person or animal usually eats. • What makes a balanced diet. • That the five main food groups are: carbohydrates, fruits and vegetables, protein, dairy and oils and spreads. • That I should eat a range of different foods from each food group, and roughly how much of each food group. • That 'ingredients' means the items in a mixture or recipe. • How to cut, grate, snip and spread to prepare foods. • How to review and give a score to evaluate.
Computing	<p>This term in computing we will be looking at Handling Data, with a focus on 'How can technology be used to present data?' The children will be learning to use the website J2E's J1T5 to create different types of graph including pictograms, tally charts, bar graphs and line graphs. They will also be creating branching databases.</p>

Reading	<p>Please bring in your reading records every day. Please see to your right as to when your books will be changed. This will continue for the year.</p> <p>Please record each time you have read in your reading record. We enjoy reading your comments, but a tick by you or your child is also useful for us to see.</p> <p>Questions are included in the back of your reading records for your parents to ask you at home-this will help to improve your comprehension skills.</p>	<p>Tuesday - Weald Wednesday - Brook Thursday - Hilden Friday - Riding</p>
Spellings and Spelling Shed	<p>Each Friday children will get a new set of spellings to practice.</p> <p>On Thursday children will do their 'Spelling Challenge' to see how they are doing. The spellings will be a mix of CEW (Common Exception Words) and words linked to the sounds that they are learning that week.</p> <p>Children will receive their new spellings on Friday, any words that were written incorrectly in the spelling challenge will also be included to practice for another week.</p>	Thursday Challenge
Library	Library day is every Monday. Please bring in your book each week to be changed.	

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Home Learning Grid Tasks	Please bring in your home learning book every Monday for checking. A new term sheet can be found in your child's book.	Monday
Maths Shed	Over the term there will be a selection of maths games available to practise the skills we are learning within the classroom. This will be updated over the term. Please try to log in to maths shed as often as you can as this will really help your child's fluency in maths.	We will check this over the term.
Knowledge Organisers	These are designed as something to look at and discuss with your child at home. This also provides children with the chance to further research any areas they find particularly interesting.	From week 1 for the term

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What do children need to bring to school?



Please can children bring the following items each day:
