Curriculum Newsletter and Parent Information: Term 4

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you had a lovely, relaxing half term with your families. We are looking forward to a very busy and exciting term ahead, including a visit to Hildenborough Library and Hyllden Heights Care Home, as well as celebrating World Book Day and British Science Week! I am also looking forward to discussing your child's progress with you at this term's parent consultations and to our Easter Service on the last day of term. Details of upcoming events this term will be sent out in separate letters.

Below, is the outline of the curriculum areas we will be covering this term:

Subject	Areas to be covered
Maths	We will continue to use Maths No Problem, which is in line with the Singapore Maths approach. This encourages children to use manipulatives to support learning and approach mathematical problems in different ways. Children will also be developing their mathematical thinking in a range of contexts with particular focus on: Comparing and ordering decimals. Calculating with decimals. Writing percentages and finding equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. Measuring and finding angles.
English	This term our focus text will be the narrative poem The Highwayman by Alfred Noyes. Our fiction writing will develop use of figurative language and descriptive language within our re-telling of the story.
	In our reading lessons, we will be looking at a range of fiction and non-fiction texts, including adaptations of The Highwayman. The key skills we are focusing on this term are identifying the meaning of unfamiliar vocabulary, exploring an author's choice of language and retrieving key details, including quotes from a whole text
	We will also be starting to read Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone in preparation for our visit to Warner Bros Studios and our film script writing next term
Science	This term, our Science topic is Properties and changes of materials . For this, we will be continuing our learning of solids, liquids and gases and developing our understanding of them. We will be learning about and investigating the thermal conductivity of various materials; which materials are and are not electrical conductors; heating and cooling materials; mixing and dissolving materials; separating mixtures; reversible and irreversible changes and burning.
	The big question this term is: When we change a material, is it always forever?
RE	This term, our RE topic is Salvation . In this topic, we will be exploring the big question: What did Jesus do to save human beings? During this topic, we will be exploring where Easter fits into the 'big story' of the Bible. We will also explore the theme of sacrifice and its significance in the Easter story. We will end the topic learning about why Jesus' sacrifice is important to Christians and reflect on how Christians show their beliefs through their actions.
Computing	In Computing this term, we will be exploring the question 'how can technology be used to collect and present data?' During this topic, we will be learning about how the Mars Rover used binary

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	code to transmit data and messages to Earth. The children will also learn how to interpret and create binary code.			
Geography	During the couple of weeks of term, we will be completing our History unit of work on 'The birth of the British Empire'. Following this, we will be moving onto this term's Geography topic, mountains. During this topic, children will learn that mountains are large landforms that rise above surrounding land. They will briefly look at plate tectonics theory, touching on the reasons why mountains form. Children will also learn that a mountain range is a group of connected mountains and will study the Alps, The Himalayas, The Rockies, The Andes. Mount Kilimanjaro will also be studied as an example of a dormant volcano.			
Art	In Art, we will continue learning about Chinese Art . This will include learning about Calligraphy and painting using ink, and designing Ming-inspired patterns for Porcelain.			
Spanish	 During term 4, we will be focussing on the following objectives: To understand the verb 'gustar' (to like) and use this in the context of a school setting. To use Me gusta (I like), te gusta (you like) in context. 			
PE	During PE this term, we will be focussing on developing our skills in handball and hockey. Children will learn the rules of the games, as well as completing skills based activities to improve their technique.			
Music	During terms 3 and 4, we will be developing our understanding of old school hip hop through our Fresh Prince of Bel Air topic.			
PSHE	This term's PSHE focus is health and wellbeing. During this unit, children will learn about the importance of relaxation and rest for our wellbeing; how to embrace failure; taking responsibility for our feelings and how to plan healthy meals.

Please can children bring the following items each day:


- A book bag or a **small** rucksack. No large bags please.
