Curriculum Newsletter and Parent Information: Term 1

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Year 3! We hope you had a restful and enjoyable summer with your families. We are excited to start the new academic year and are looking forward to sharing the fantastic curriculum for the children's first year in Key Stage 2.

Alongside this newsletter, we have included knowledge organisers for this term's subjects, which will provide you with a useful overview of what the children will be learning about this term. Please use these resources to support and extend your child's learning at home. Home learning books will be sent home on Friday 13th September. We are looking forward to meeting with you all at 'meet the teacher' on Monday 9th September, but if you have any questions or queries in the meantime please don't hesitate to get in touch.

Below, is the outline of the curriculum areas we will be covering this term:

Subject	Areas to be covered
Maths	<p>We will continue to use Maths No Problem which is in line with the Singapore Maths approach. This encourages children to use manipulatives to support learning and approach mathematical problems in a variety of ways. Children will also be developing their mathematical thinking in a range of contexts with particular focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reading, comparing, ordering, rounding and estimating numbers up to 1000• Adding and subtracting, including with renaming• Multiplication and division for the 3x, 4x and 8x tables <p>We will be using Time Tables Rockstars to support the children in learning their multiplication tables, weekly in school and as a home resource.</p>
English	<p>Our writing this term is based on the fictional text How To Wash A Woolly Mammoth by Michelle Robins and Kate Hindley. We will be using this text as inspiration for writing our own instruction texts, with a focus on making effective use of imperative verbs and adverbials to sequence their writing. Later in the term, we will be exploring the story The Tin Forest by Helen Ward and Wayne Anderson. We will be using this text to write our own stories, with a focus on making effective use of vocabulary to describe a setting.</p> <p>We will be looking at a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry in our weekly reading lessons. During our reading lessons, we will be developing our VIPERS skills (Vocabulary, Infer, Predict, Explain, Retrieve and Summarise).</p>
Science	<p>This term we focus on forces - magnetism in particular. They will learn about forces in the context of pushing and pulling, and identify different actions as pushes or pulls. They will develop their scientific enquiry skills, making observations, predictions and conclusions. Working collaboratively, they will investigate friction by testing the movement of a toy car over different surfaces. They will work in a hands-on way to identify magnetic materials and observe how the magnetic poles can attract and repel. Furthermore, they will conduct an investigation into the strength of different types of magnets.</p>
RE	<p>Our learning this term focus on the People of God and, in particular, Noah. Through his story we will be answering these big questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Can the children make the link between the story of Noah and the idea of covenant?• What are the links between promises in the story of Noah and promises that Christians make at a wedding ceremony?• What are the links between the story of Noah and how we live in school and the wider world?



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Computing	This term, Computing will focus on Online Safety: How do we use technology respectfully, safely and responsibly? The children will find out about the online community, how to be safe and show respect to others online.
History	This term, we will begin to learn about the Stone Age (Mesolithic period) to the Iron Age (@43CE - the start of the Roman invasion) a period of about 10,000 years. The children will learn why it was called the Stone Age, who lived in those times and how and where they lived - from hunter-gatherers to the first settlers in Skara Brae. We will advance through the Bronze Age and then onto the Iron Age, looking at the development of society, migration, religion, trade and conflict through these times.
Art	This term we will be focussing on Line – considering the statement Paul Klee made, "A drawing is simply a line going for a walk." We will explore different media to create lines and conclude the unit by creating our own print inspired by Katsushika Hokusai's <i>The Great Wave off Kanagawa</i> .
Music	The class will join with Year 4 to learn a range of songs, from the musical Hairspray to Bob Marley's greatest hits, in preparation for the Young Voices concert at the O2 in January.
Spanish	This term, year 3 will be learning about the verb 'I can'. We will look at some of the basic grammatical principles, including verb tenses, as well as developing their Spanish pronunciation! This will give them a solid foundation to build on as they acquire new vocabulary throughout the year.
PE	PE will be on a Friday afternoon, this term's is Dance . Remember that on Friday children will need to come to school in their PE kit. On Thursday mornings, Mrs Rugg will lead Forest School .
PSHE	We use a comprehensive PSHE programme to support us in developing fully rounded children who are healthy, sociable and emotionally literate. It covers key concepts and skills to support pupils' spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development and teach British Values. The programme builds on the core theme areas identified by the PSHE Association: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Health and Wellbeing• Relationships• Living in the Wider World

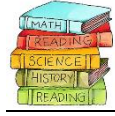

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Home Learning



Home learning will begin on **Monday 9th September**. We will be going through details of this year's home learning at 'meet the teacher'. In the meantime, please ensure that your child is reading daily at home and continues to regularly practise their times tables on Times Table Rock Stars.

PE and Forest School



PE during term 1 will take place on Fridays. Please ensure that your child comes into school in their PE kit. They will need:

- their house-coloured PE t-shirt
- black/navy shorts or a skort (in warmer weather)/jogging bottoms (in colder weather)
- trainers
- grey/white socks

We are fortunate to have Forest School every Thursday morning. On this day, please send your child into school in their school uniform with their Forest School clothing in a named carrier bag. Depending on weather, we would recommend children wearing the following items for forest school:

- warm socks
- layers are best- leggings and jogging bottoms
- T-shirt/long sleeved top
- jumper or fleece
- waterproof trousers or all-in-one suits
- waterproof jackets or all-in-one suits
- hat, scarf and gloves
- Wellington boots

What do children need to bring to school?

Please can children bring the following items each day:

- A book bag or a **small** rucksack. No large bags please.
- A clearly labelled water bottle.
- A packed lunch (if not having school lunch).
- Their reading book and reading record.
- A sun hat and sun cream when the weather is warm (if they can self-administer and weather permitting).
- A coat/hats and gloves (weather permitting).
- A pencil case (preferable-not too large please!).



If the weather is warm, parents will be advised to put sun-cream on their child before coming to school. **Children are only allowed to bring into school the items listed above**, i.e.. no, toys etc.
